Theater Alaska Presents Every Brilliant Thing

Powerful one-person show about family and mental health

Juneau, AK, January 3, 2022 - Theater Alaska announced that the play *Every Brilliant Thing* by Duncan Macmillan and Jonny Donahoe will perform in Juneau, January 14-20 at multiple locations. Theater Alaska company member Tommy Schoffler performs, and the production is directed by Theater Alaska Producing Artistic Director Flordelino Lagundino. All performances are free to the public.

In *Every Brilliant Thing*, a six year old boy finds out his mom is in the hospital. She's "done something stupid," his father tells him. She finds it hard to be happy. So the boy starts to make a list of everything that's brilliant about the world. Everything that's worth living for. 1. Ice cream. 2. Water fights. 6. Roller Coasters. 25. Wearing a cape. Soon, the list will take on a life of its own. Humorous and poignant, *Every Brilliant Thing* is a play about mental health and the things we do to support the ones we love.

Every Brilliant Thing is produced by Theater Alaska in partnership with NAMI Juneau, Juneau Suicide Prevention Coalition, and Juneau Public Libraries. It is also supported in part by the Juneau Arts and Humanities Council and the City and Borough of Juneau. The media sponsor for the production is KTOO.

"Mental health is an important issue in Alaska and we are excited to present a play that tackles it with humor, joy, and warmth," says Theater Alaska Producing Director Flordelino.

"We are grateful for Theater Alaska bringing *Every Brilliant Thing* to our community and for the opportunity to partner with them," says NAMI Juneau Executive Director Aaron Surma. "The storyline of this production helps to bring awareness to suicide, which is the first step in reducing stigma and promoting mental health care."

At each performance, there will be a talkback and NAMI Juneau and Juneau Suicide Prevention Coaltion will provide information about mental health.

Every Brilliant Thing will feature set, costume, and properties design by An-Lin Dauber, and sound design by Matt Otto.
